Match background

Somewhat surprisingly for two teams of considerable European pedigree, this is a first meeting for Monaco and Atlético Madrid, and each will be keen to hit the ground running in Group A.

- The sides both suffered early exits from last season's UEFA Champions League, although for Atlético there was considerable consolation as they went on to win the UEFA Europa League for the third time in nine years. Monaco, meanwhile, bowed out of Europe altogether at the conclusion of the group stage having finished bottom of a section including Beşiktaş, Porto and RB Leipzig.

Form guide

Monaco

- Second in Ligue 1 last season, Monaco reached the 2016/17 UEFA Champions League semi-finals but finished bottom of their group last season having collected two points from their six games.
- Monaco are without a win in eight European games (D2 L6), since a 3-1 home victory against Borussia Dortmund in the quarter-final second leg in April 2017.
- The French side have won their last three matches against Spanish Liga opposition, including away (2-1) and home (1-0) victories against Villarreal in the 2016/17 play-offs.
- Monaco have lost only once at home to Spanish visitors, and are unbeaten in their last seven such encounters (W6 D1).
- Runners-up in 2004, Monaco remain the last French team to reach the UEFA Champions League final.

Atlético

- UEFA Champions League finalists in 2014 and 2016, and semi-finalists two seasons ago, Atlético won only one game in the 2017/18 competition, drawing four to finish behind Roma and Chelsea in their section.
- However, Los Rojiblancos then moved into the UEFA Europa League, winning their first five matches and losing only one of nine overall as they defeated Marseille 3-0 in the Lyon final.
- Atlético have won their last two matches against French clubs, and have lost only one of their 13 fixtures against Ligue 1 sides. They are unbeaten in their last five such fixtures (W3 D2).
- Diego Simeone's side have already lifted European silverware this season, beating Real Madrid 4-2 in August's UEFA Super Cup in Tallinn – making them the first team to win the competition on their first three appearances.
- Atlético have therefore won their last three European games, and have lost only one of their last 14 matches in continental competition (W9 D4).
- The Rojiblancos have reached two UEFA Champions League and three UEFA Europa League finals in the last nine seasons.

Links and trivia

- Thomas Lemar joined Atlético from Monaco this summer having made 90 appearances for the Ligue 1 side, scoring 16 goals. He was part of the side that lifted the French title and reached the UEFA Champions League semi-finals in 2016/17.
- Radamel Falcao scored 52 goals in 68 matches for Atlético between 2011 and 2013, including two in the 2012 UEFA Europa League final victory against Athletic Club, and also featured in the 2013 Copa del Rey final win against Real Madrid.
- Antoine Griezmann scored past Danijel Subasić in France's 4-2 defeat of Croatia in the FIFA World Cup final in July; Atlético's Lucas Hernández was also in the France team, with Djibril Sidibé of Monaco and Lemar unused substitutes.
- Aleksandr Golovin helped Russia beat a Spain side featuring Koke and Diego Costa in the World Cup round of 16, scoring in the hosts' shoot-out victory.
- Falcao scored in both Porto's games against Atlético in the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League group stage.

**Not in UEFA Champions League squad*

- Monaco were beaten 4-0 by Paris Saint-Germain in the Trophée des Champions on 4 August.
- Monaco have won only one of their six matches this season, the 3-1 success at Nantes on the opening day of Ligue 1 on 11 August. They have lost three, including two in a row before Saturday's 1-1 draw at Toulouse.
- Having not scored in 27 Ligue 1 appearances in 2017/18, Youri Tielemans has two goals in five matches in the current campaign, scoring in each of the last two.
- Djibril Sidibé was part of the victorious France squad at this summer's FIFA World Cup, playing one game in Russia.
- Tielemans made four appearances for Belgium at the World Cup, including the 2-0 defeat of England in the third-placed play-off.
- Radamel Falcao was on target in Colombia's 2-1 friendly win against Venezuela on 8 September.

**Not in UEFA Champions League squad*

- Koke's next appearance in the UEFA Champions League will be his 50th.
- Diego Costa scored twice in Atlético's 4-2 extra-time defeat of Real Madrid in the UEFA Super Cup in Tallinn on 15 August. Saúl Ñíguez and Koke were also on target, Lemar making his first Atlético appearance.
- Five points from four matches this season represents Atlético's worst start to a Liga campaign under Diego Simeone. They were held 1-1 at home by Eibar on Saturday, and only escaped defeat thanks to an added-time equaliser from 19-year-old substitute Borja Garcés.
- Saúl scored his first international goal in Spain's 2-1 victory against England at Wembley in the UEFA Nations League on 8 September. Three days later, he opened the scoring in a 6-0 defeat of Croatia in his home town of Elche.
- Stefan Savić scored for Montenegro against Lithuania in the UEFA Nations League while José María Giménez was on target as Uruguay beat Mexico 4-1 in a friendly.
- Antoine Griezmann scored four times in seven appearances – including a penalty in the final defeat of Croatia – as France won the FIFA World Cup this summer. Lucas Hernández also played in every game, with Lemar featuring once.
- Vitolo sprained a knee in the 1-1 draw at Valencia on 20 August and has not played since.
- Nikola Kalinić (ankle), and Santi Arias (fractured rib) have also been sidelined. Juanfran (muscle) returned to face Eibar, although Lucas Hernández had to be taken to hospital on the eve of the game with severe abdominal pains.

- Played football at an amateur level during his youth and despite a passing interest in handball, it was always Jardim's intention to become a coach. Studied physical education at the University of Madeira, and at 24 became the youngest Portuguese coach to obtain a UEFA A licence.
- Three years later, in 2001, appointed assistant coach at Madeiran club Camacha, where he impressed sufficiently to take charge of first-team duties two years later. Left to join Chaves midway through 2007/08, masterminding rise to the second division 18 months later. Also won promotion at Beira-Mar after taking charge in summer 2009 and preserved their top-flight status the following season before stepping down.
- Signed a three-year contract when he succeeded Domingos Paciência at Braga in 2011 but left after only one having guided the club to a third-placed finish, helped by a record-breaking 13 successive league wins at the turn of the year, and into the UEFA Europa League round of 16.
- Confirmed as the new coach of Olympiacos in June 2012, putting pen to paper on a two-year contract, but dismissed the following January despite a ten-point lead in the league. Resurfaced at Sporting, leading the club to second place in the 2013/14 Portuguese Liga.
- Subsequently succeeded Claudio Ranieri at Monaco, guiding the club to the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals in 2014/15, when they finished third in Ligue 1. Jardim and Monaco were third again the following season; that set up a remarkable run to the UEFA Champions League semi-finals in 2016/17, an attack-minded young side also winning Ligue 1 ahead of Paris Saint-Germain, before finishing second a year later.

Diego Simeone

- Launched career as a combative midfielder with Vélez Sarsfield and was a full Argentinian international at 18, making debut in a July 1988 friendly against Australia; went on to play in three FIFA World Cups and retired as Argentina's most-capped player (106 appearances, 11 goals). Moved to Italy in 1990 to join Pisa; two years later he left for Sevilla, where he played under Argentina's 1986 World Cup-winning coach Carlos Bilardo and – for one season – alongside Diego Maradona.
- Joined Atlético in 1994 and won the Spanish domestic double in his second season, his first major club honours to add to two Copa América titles (1991 and 1993) plus the 1992 FIFA Confederations Cup with Argentina.
- Enjoyed further success after returning to Italy, winning the UEFA Cup with Inter, plus a Serie A and Coppa Italia double in his debut campaign with Lazio (1999/2000). After four years in Rome, he returned to Madrid for a second spell with Atlético before ending his playing career in Argentina with Racing Club.
- Started coaching career with Racing Club and won Argentinian titles with Estudiantes (2006 Apertura) and River Plate (2008 Clausura); brief spells at San Lorenzo, Italian club Catania and Racing (again) preceded his appointment in December 2011 at Atlético.
- Led Atlético to victory in the 2012 UEFA Europa League final against Athletic Club and to a Copa del Rey final triumph over Real Madrid in 2013. A year later, Atlético held off Barcelona and Madrid to win their first league title since 1996, although they lost to Madrid in the UEFA Champions League final. Took Atlético to another UEFA Champions League final in 2016, which they again lost to Madrid, but collected more silverware two years later with another UEFA Europa League triumph and followed up by finally getting the better of Madrid in Europe with victory in the UEFA Super Cup.
