Match background

Napoli will be looking to make their home form count and get a first win on the board in Group C when they welcome last season's runners-up Liverpool.

- The Italian side were held 0-0 away to debutants Crvena zvezda on matchday one, while Liverpool let slip a two-goal lead in their heavyweight contest with Paris Saint-Germain before substitute Roberto Firmino's added-time strike secured a 3-2 victory at Anfield.

Previous meetings

- The clubs have met only twice before, in the 2010/11 UEFA Europa League group stage. The game in Naples ended scoreless; Ezequiel Lavezzi gave Napoli a first-half lead at Anfield before Steven Gerrard's hat-trick in the final 15 minutes, including goals in the 88th and 89th minutes, secured a dramatic late win for Liverpool.
- The Reds went on to finish top of their section, with Napoli in second place; the Italian club were eliminated in the round of 32, Liverpool losing in the last 16.

Form guide

Napoli

- Serie A runners-up in 2017/18, Napoli are in the group stage for the fifth time – all in the last eight seasons. They reached the round of 16 in 2011/12 and 2016/17.
- The Italian club finished third in their section last season – winning two of their three home matches and losing the other – and went on to the UEFA Europa League round of 32, where they lost to RB Leipzig.
- Napoli's last home game against English visitors brought a 4-2 defeat by Manchester City in last season's group stage – their first home reverse against Premier League opponents in their sixth such encounter (W4 D1).
- The Italian side have lost two of their last three home European matches, including a 1-3 loss against Leipzig in their most recent outing. However, they have suffered only four losses in their last 26 European home fixtures (W16 D6).
- They have won only two of their last six home games in the UEFA Champions League group stage to final, losing three.

Liverpool

- Fourth in the Premier League in 2017/18, Liverpool are in the group stage for the second season running, having featured once in the previous seven.
- Liverpool scored an average of 3.15 goals per game in the 2017/18 UEFA Champions League.
- The five-time winners reached their eighth European Cup final in 2017/18, when they won four of their seven UEFA Champions League away matches (qualifying included), losing only one.
- Liverpool were beaten on their last trip to Italy – also their most recent European away game – going down 4-2 at Roma in last season's semi-final second leg, only a second defeat in their last 14 European away fixtures. The Reds have nevertheless won just five of their last 19 (D8 L6).
- The Reds have lost only two of their last eight away games against Italian clubs, winning three.

- Napoli are the eighth club Carlo Ancelotti has coached in the UEFA Champions League, after Parma, Juventus, Milan, Chelsea, Paris, Real Madrid and Bayern, extending his own competition record.

**Not in UEFA Champions League squad*

- Under new coach Carlo Ancelotti, Napoli have won five of their first seven Serie A games this season, the exceptions a 3-0 loss at Sampdoria on 2 September and Saturday's 3-1 defeat at Juventus.
- Having not kept a clean sheet in their first three games this season, the Partenopei had managed three in four matches in all competitions before shipping three goals at Juve.
- Lorenzo Insigne has scored twice against Torino (3-1) and once against Parma (3-0) since matchday one and has already found the net five times in Serie A this season; he managed eight in the whole of 2017/18.
- Arkadiusz Milik got two against Parma and has three goals in six Serie A games in the current campaign; he scored five in each of his first two campaigns with the Partenopei.
- The game with Torino was Piotr Zieliński's 100th for Napoli; he received a plaque celebrating the event before the home game against Parma.
- Goalkeeper Alex Meret broke his arm soon after joining Napoli this summer, while Faouzi Ghoulam underwent knee surgery in July having not played since 1 November 2017.
- New signing Amin Younes has had an operation on a ruptured Achilles tendon; Vlad Chiricheş ruptured the cruciate ligament in his left knee in Romania's game against Montenegro on 7 September.

- Jürgen Klopp's side won their first six Premier League matches this season, beating Southampton 3-0 after matchday one – the first time in the club's history they have kicked off a season with six league victories.
- Liverpool had not won six league matches in a row since a run of nine successive victories between February and April 2014.
- This season's sequence was ended by Saturday's 1-1 draw at Chelsea, a late goal from substitute Daniel Sturridge preserving the club's unbeaten record in the 2018/19 Premier League.
- The Reds bowed out of the English League Cup after a 2-1 loss to Chelsea at Anfield in the third round on 26 September.
- Liverpool paid a world-record fee for a goalkeeper this summer to bring in Alisson from Roma – this was quickly eclipsed by Chelsea's signing of Kepa Arrizabalaga.
- James Milner's nine assists in the 2017/18 UEFA Champions League set a new competition record.
- Dejan Lovren played all seven games as Croatia reached the World Cup final in Russia. He made his first appearance of the season in the League Cup game against Chelsea after a pelvis problem.
- Virgil van Dijk suffered bruised ribs against Southampton on 22 September, but recovered to play on Saturday.
- Adam Lallana has not played since 20 August due to a groin injury.
- Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain is unlikely to play this season after suffering a serious knee injury in last season's UEFA Champions League semi-final first leg against Roma on 24 April.

Head coach

Carlo Ancelotti

Date of birth: 10 June 1959

Nationality: Italian

Playing career: Parma, Roma, AC Milan

Coaching career: Reggiana, Parma, Juventus, AC Milan, Chelsea, Paris Saint-Germain, Real Madrid, Bayern München, Napoli

- One of only seven people to have lifted the European Champion Clubs' Cup as both a player and coach and the second manager, after Bob Paisley, to win the trophy three times. A combative midfielder, Ancelotti helped Roma win the 1983 Serie A title and four Italian Cups before joining Milan in 1986 where he added two more league championships, as well as back-to-back European Cup triumphs in 1989 and 1990.
- Began coaching in 1995 with a year at Reggiana, earning them promotion from Serie B, before two seasons at Parma. Replaced Marcello Lippi at Juventus in February 1999 and returned to San Siro as coach of Milan in 2001. During eight seasons in charge, won the UEFA Champions League in 2003 and 2007, but lost the 2005 final on penalties to Liverpool FC after leading 3-0. Milan also won a Serie A title, a Coppa Italia and the 2007 FIFA Club World Cup.
- Resigned on 31 May 2009 and was named as Chelsea's new manager the following day. His first season in London ended with the club winning the league and cup double for the first time. Dismissed at the end of his second campaign, Ancelotti took charge of Paris in December 2011, steering the club to a first league title in 19 years in 2012/13, his sole full season in charge.
- Left to take over at Madrid, winning the Copa del Rey and the club's tenth European Cup in his first season, becoming only the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs in the process. Madrid then added the UEFA Super Cup, the fourth time Ancelotti had won that trophy as player or coach, before his dismissal at the end of 2014/15.
- That December he was appointed by Bayern, taking the reins in summer 2016 and winning the Bundesliga in his debut campaign, when he also became the first man to coach seven clubs in the UEFA Champions League. Dismissed in September 2017, he returned to Italy to take over at Napoli the following year.

Coaching career: Mainz, Borussia Dortmund, Liverpool

- Having spent his early career in the lower leagues and failed to break into Eintracht's first team, Klopp turned professional with Mainz, starting off as a striker before becoming a no-nonsense defender. Never played in the top flight but made 325 second-division appearances from 1990 to 2001, setting a club record by scoring 52 goals.
- 'Kloppo', as he is known in Germany, was appointed Mainz's caretaker coach on 28 February 2001, helping the club avoid relegation to the third tier. Duly won a permanent contract and built Mainz into one of the strongest clubs in the 2. Bundesliga; narrowly missed out on promotion in 2002 and 2003 before finally taking Mainz into the top flight for the first time in 2004 and kept them in the Bundesliga until 2007, taking them into the 2005/06 UEFA Cup via the UEFA Fair Play ranking.
- After another promotion near-miss in 2007/08 Klopp left for Dortmund. Took them to sixth in his first season, led them into the UEFA Europa League the next year and then, with a squad full of exciting young talent, oversaw league title wins in 2010/11 and 2011/12, adding the German Cup in the latter campaign with a 5-2 final victory against Bayern München.
- Earned even greater admiration in 2012/13 as he steered Dortmund all the way to the UEFA Champions League final at Wembley, where they lost to Bayern. Dortmund reached another domestic cup final in 2014, but again came up short against Bayern.
- Announced in April 2015 he was leaving Dortmund after that season, which ended with a cup final defeat against Wolfsburg. Succeeded Brendan Rodgers as Liverpool manager in October 2015 and took the team to the finals of the English League Cup and UEFA Europa League – helped by a quarter-final defeat of Dortmund – in his first season. Lost both, and there was more final disappointment in 2017/18, which ended in defeat by Real Madrid in the UEFA Champions League decider in Kyiv.
